## Administration / Organization



- Easy and fast
- Very smooth (Most frequent comment)
- Well organized
- .. all the Officers were very helpful



#### Criticism:

- Opening session: The longest queue were at the travel reimbursement point
- The only thing is that the travel expenses form was very unclear - the English wasn't great and it was difficult to work out exactly what would or would not be reimbursed



- Very nice accommodation (most frequent comment)
- Housekeeping staff was great!
- No luxus, but everything you really need to have
- Criticism Main hostel:
  - Kitchen was not large enough
  - Number of pots and frying pans is clearly insufficient
  - It would be great if there is a microwave
  - My items in the fridge frozeseveral times
  - Loud kitchen parties
  - The kitchen was dirty

## Housing

- Criticism main hostel:

     with any level of effectiveness




- The kitchen hasn't enough equipment or workspace for 20 people.. really uncomfortable

## Work at DESY

## Work at DESY

#### Criticism:

- Some students complained that they felt a bit unattended by their supervisors ... and that lowers the motivation dramatically
- Problematic since the group had difficulties with the workshop and delivery dates, therefore I had to stay put
- I was unlucky because the main device, that I would have to characterize, did not work correctly
- Way over my head, I found myself unprepared and unskilled in almost all tasks asked of me

## Lectures in general



- Lecture program was good but many lecturers overran their timeslots
- Some of them perfect, some boring
- .. the only negative thing I can say is that it was sometimes a bit hard for me to follow as it was the first time I met some of the concepts
- The lecture for me were too specialistic.
- Too informative and not always well connected between each other, too much stuff thrown them to simply say many things



## Lectures in general

- 3-4 hours of lecture every day for HEP students may be too much
- I found there was a lot of overlap with the photon science lectures, hearing the same things in one lecture followed by another

Since we are aware of the problem of information overloaded lectures we try to encourage lecturers to follow a modern pedagogic strategy

### Sandwich principle teaching:

20-25 minutes lecture

3-10 minutes students activation

20-25 minutes lecture

. . .

The activation phase can be many different things, e.g. small Interactive (paper) exercises, discussions among the students, some stimulating questions, Quiz, etc.

Lectures with such students interactive parts (even homework) obtained better ratings





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
