Krameramtsstuben, near to Michel, in a backyard, a large part of Hamburg looked like this before the big fire in 1842, cozy but also dark and very tight




Hamburg Ueberseebruecke – Cap San Diego – Cargo museum ship in running conditions \rightarrow a visit is really nice









Speicherstadt:: built 1885-1927 (was) the largest warehouse district in the world





Miniatur Wunderland : largest model railway in the world and by far far the biggest tourist attraction in Hamburg (based on #visitors)




Miniatur Wunderland : Check on their webpage the queue time or visit late in the evening

St. Nikolai Church, destroyed in the bombing of Hamburg end of july 1943, Operation "Gomorrha", since then a memorial





Hamburger Sommer DOM = movable amusement park, opens 26th july 2017








Ikea furniture shop on grosse Bergstrasse, Altona: the first ever Ikea in a city centre, very popular (also the restaurant/café)




