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# Terminology

## Research information

= All information about scientist and their activities such as publications, projects, etc.; usually meta data - collected and combined in the system

## Research data

= All data collected within research activities, e.g. observation data, experiments, simulations, etc.\*

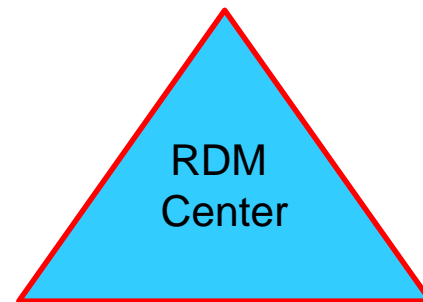
## Research data management

= Research information management is the aggregation, curation, and utilization of information about research\*\*

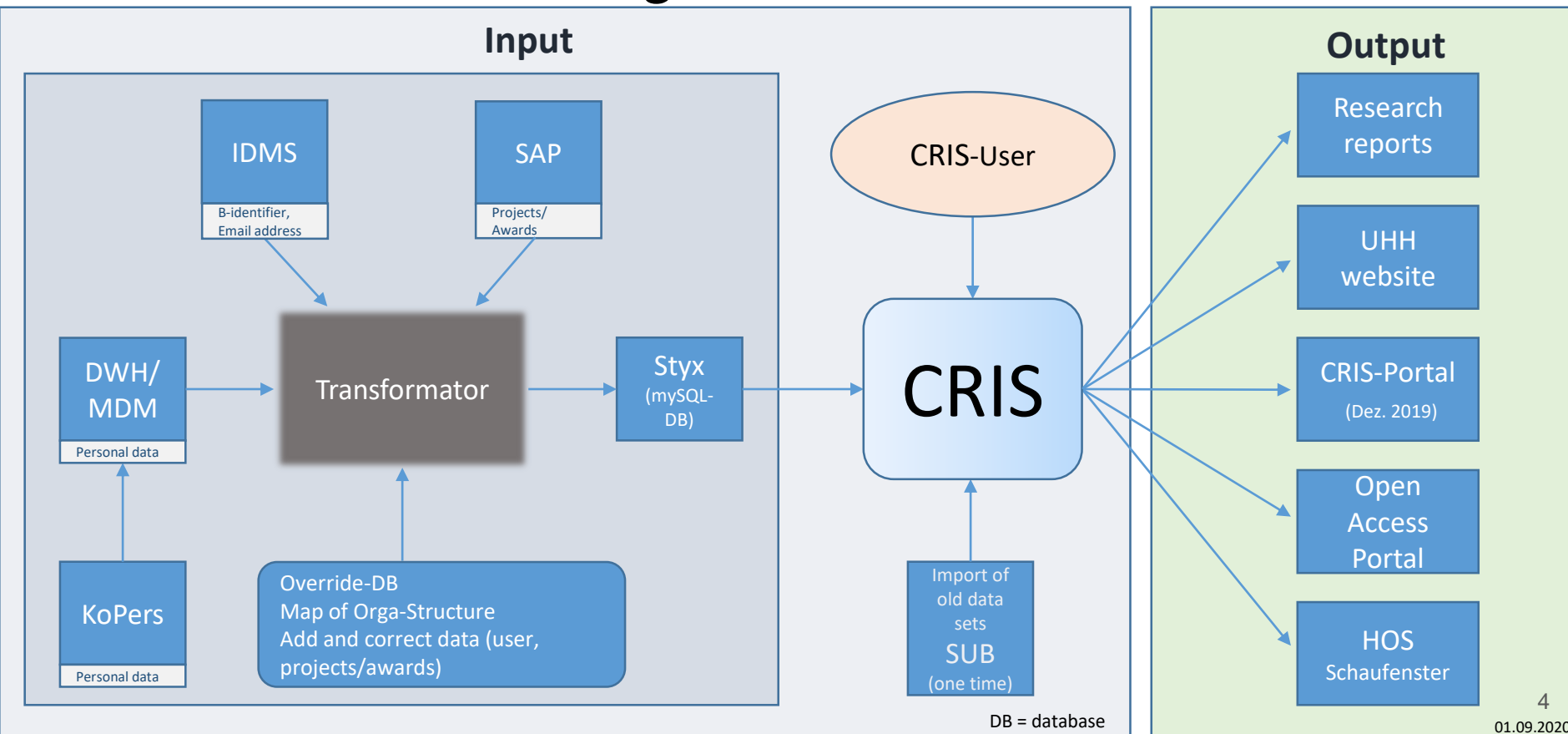

# CRIS of UHH

## Objectives:

1. **Authorized and simplified preparation of research reports (via an integrated and unified database and processes between scientific research and administration)**
  2. **Assist the research administration with providing data collections and processes**
- Creation of overviews, statistical reports and analysis (all pursuant to the CRIS-service agreement “FIS-Dienstvereinbarung”)
- Software PURE (manufacturer *Atira*, acquired by Elsevier 2012)

# CRIS: Features & Services (1/2)

- Bibliography including integrated full-text archive (repository)
  - Applications, reports, research outputs
  - Management of open access documentary (visibility, embargo periods)
- Directory of projects
  - Third-party funded projects (“Drittmittelprojekte”), state funding projects (“landesmittelfinanzierte Projekte”), projects without budgets
  - Connect and display: project description, employees and partners, expenses, outcome (publications, activities)
- Directory of experts: Entries related to persons including CV, positions, ministries and activities
- Directory of funding and collaborations (external cooperation partners: persons and organizations)










## CRIS: Features & Services (2/2)

- Database for web applications (e.g. personal UHH website, *Open Access* portal)
- Reporting system – Creation of overviews, statistics and analysis; bibliometrics (citations, impact factors, journal ratings,...)
- Workflows:
  - Application of third-party funded projects (AMM = Award Management Module):  
applications and contracts → awards → projects
  - Dual-control-principle during process of validation (projects and publications)

# CRIS in numbers - Status quo

- Online since Nov. 2018
- > 43.500 publications (started with > 6000); > 8500 project data sets
- > 3400 (active) users
- ~20 editors within the institutions (e.g. CEN, Cluster Quantum Universe, dept. 4)
- > 20.000 external organizations

# Which research contents are recorded in the CRIS?

-  ● Research outputs (incl. patents)
-  ● Projects
-  ● Awards
-  ● Applications and contracts
-  ● Persons (personal profiles)
-  ● Activities (talks, guest residence)
-  ● Prizes
-  ● Facilities/Equipment (large-scale equipment, research infrastructure)
-  ● (Press clippings from external sources, Scopus; coordination with dept. 2)



# Opportunities of collecting and recording data

1. Automated import from source systems (via web services)
  - Organizational unit (SAP, soon via DWH)
  - Persons (KoPers via DWH) und projects (SAP)
    - Linkage of projects and persons by information linked to the organizational structure ((permanent) post, cost center, cost distribution)
    - Bibliometrics (PlumX, Altmetric, etc.)
  
2. Manuel import by the users
  - Import from online sources (e.g. Web of Science, ORCID, ArXiv, PubMed, Mendeley, etc.)
  - Import from .ris or .bibtex files
  
3. Manuel input by individual users (or editors of the department)
  - Research outputs, activities, press entries, etc.
