# Matter and Technologies 8th Annual Meeting 26<sup>th</sup>-27<sup>th</sup> September 2022



The **Matter and Technologies annual meeting** will take place from **September 26th to 27th 2022** at DESY, Hamburg. We are very much looking forward to welcoming you to the meeting, which is going to take place primarily as an in-person event, with the possibility to also participate remotely. As usual we will have a combination of invited talks from international experts on our topics of accelerator, detector and data science, as well as parallel sessions to present and discuss selected program results. In addition, there will be a poster session including speed talks, to which we in particular invite early career scientists to submit their abstracts (unfortunately the poster session will only be accessible by on-site participants, not by remote participants).

#### Venue

Due to unexpected developments, the location of the meeting had to be changed and the meeting as well as the student retreat will be hosted by DESY in Hamburg. The meeting will be organized jointly by DESY and the Forschungszentrum Jülich. At DESY, the plenary sessions will take place in the main auditorium, the parallel sessions will be spread out over the campus. We will supply a map indicating the relevant buildings and the place of each session can be looked up on the agenda. We are planning a Zoom connection to all sessions though we are in particular encouraging the speakers to attend in person. The Zoom connections will be available on the Indico page before the meeting.

# **Corona Rules**

There are currently only few restrictions in place concerning Corona: DESY enforces that only every second seat in seminar rooms and lecture halls can be occupied. We are sorry that, in hopefully rare occasions, we might have to limit the number of people who can participate in specific events.

DESY strongly recommends wearing a FFP2 mask if large crowds of people gather and the recommended distances cannot be maintained.
